
There are an estimated 300,000 stray dogs on the streets and beaches of Puerto Rico, and an estimated 1 million stray cats. Each year, over 90,000 animals are euthanized because they were homeless. Most euthanized animals are healthy and adoptable.

By choosing to adopt a pet from a rescue, you are not only providing that animal with a home, but also making space for another animal that might otherwise face euthanasia. You are saving two lives.

Our adoption fee is 100\$ for adult dogs and 150\$ for puppies or breed dogs (waived if adopter pays overseas transport costs). This includes:

- an adoring dog/puppy (Pets make our lives better!)
- spay/neuter surgery
- initial DHLPP vaccination
- rabies vaccination
- 4DX test for ehrlichia, anaplasma, heartworm and lyme disease
- worming



Adoption and Foster Program

ADLA operates a no-kill shelter located in the beach town of Piñones, Puerto Rico. We work hard to find rescued dogs forever homes either in Puerto Rico or in the mainland United States where they do not have the overpopulation problem we have in our area.

Foster parents are always needed. As a foster, you will be a vital part of our

organization; and allow our rescue dogs a life in a loving home so they establish a positive bond with people. Additionally, by fostering a dog, you are providing space in our Shelter for other rescues.



The spay/neuter (S/N) of one pet prevents the birth of thousands of other animals. ADLA organizes low-cost spay/neuter clinics for pet owners on a limited income. We also practice trap/neuter/release of animals that are cannot be kept in the shelter environment.

Assistance programs

We consider pets members of the family, and medical care can be expensive! We sponsor emergency medical assistance to help individuals and families who are on a limited income and cannot afford a special procedure or medication their pet needs to stay healthy.

We are a nonprofit 501(c)3 organization committed to acting as a voice for all animals in Puerto Rico. We rescue, rehabilitate and rehome companion animals abandoned on the streets and beaches. We also work with the local community, tourists, media, government and educators to foster respect for all animal life and proper pet care.

ADLA volunteers give of their time to care for our shelter residents as we seek loving and happy homes for them. ADLA relies heavily on contributions and fundraising, and does not receive any type of tax or government funding. Ask your employer about matching gifts and matching volunteer hours.

ADLA recognizes the importance of education as a vehicle for social change. We work to educate the community on responsible pet ownership, as well as humane treatment of all animals. We offer school conferences as well as accept groups into the shelter to learn more about pet care. Additionally, ADLA coordinates Puerto Rico's only six-day Animal Control Officer-Cruelty Investigator certification course alongside Puerto Rico's Department of Health and the Career Development Institute.
